Sub: Amalgamation, Merger, Demerger or Reconstruction of Companies, or court consent terms maximum Stamp Duty payable shall be Rs. 10,00,000/- for all Companies

Respected Sir,

The differential stamp duty regime prevalent in different States inhibits merger and acquisition activity. It has been a question for consideration whether an order of a court sanctioning a compromise/arrangement under Sections 391-394 of the Companies Act, 1956 would be stampable as a "conveyance" at the rates applicable to such entry in the various state Stamp Acts. Certain states like Maharashtra, Gujarat, Karnataka and Rajasthan sought to address this problem by amending their stamp legislations to make an order of the High Court under Sections 391-394 stampable.

We would like to bring to your kind attention that in Maharashtra that have enacted their own Stamp Act, the rates applicable as: 0.7% of value of shares allotted OR 7% of value of immovable properties in Maharashtra subject to a ceiling of 10% of the value of shares.

Central Government has given tax exemption in Income tax u/s 47(13) to Partnership and LLP to convert into Limited Co with conditions that 51% shareholder should not change in next 5 years. This is helping in corporatization and we request that State must participate in Central objectives.

Basically, When the Merger of the company happens within the family For E.g Enity belongs to Father is merged with entity belonging to his Wife or son without any consideration to make one strong Entity. In such scenario Govt. to fix the Stamp Duty on Amalgamation, merger, demerger, etc under orders of High Court as per which, it should be a maximum of Rs. 10,00,000/
