2-3% cut in stamp duty likely by Aug-end: Min

2-3% reduction in stamp duty on property registrations in the state is likely to boost property registrations, according to state revenue minister Balasaheb Thorat. Though it may affect the state exchequer, the minister told TOI that the proposal is being discussed by the government.

"Developers want reduced stamp duty rates. As of now, it is 5% across the state, and we are considering to reduce it by 2-3 %. A final decision will be taken at the end of this month," he told TOI on Friday.

After a realistic examination, ready reckoner rates will also be reduced by August-end, he added.

CREDAI, the developers' association, had demanded a reduction in stamp duty to boost property transactions that have fallen by nearly 70-80% from last year.

Vice-president of CRE-DAI Shantilal Kataria said stamp duty must be reduced to 1% for at least six months
