We, at MCHI, once again congratulate you on your appointment as Chief Secretary, Government of Maharashtra and sincerely look forward to a fruitful way forward in fulfilling the need to see the changes that have been the prime need of the people of the MMR region i.e. 'Homes For All'.

A number of key issues facing the Real Estate Industry are crippling the sector, which require prompt remedial action. The same have been discussed with the Hon'ble Chief Minister during the meets held on 1st May, 2012 and 18th September, 2012. In this respect, the last meet of the MCHI delegation with the then Hon'ble Chief Secretary, Shri Ratnakar Gaikwad was held around nine months back i.e. on 9th April, 2012. (A copy of the minutes of the same is attached herewith).

HIGH RISE COMMITTEE	It was submitted to the Chief Minister that the Municipal Commissioner had prescribed 120 mtrs. as the minimum height.
